Thank Your School Public Health Clinicians During National Public Health Week

National Public Health Week is April 5-11. Although this will be Spring Break, please take time to thank your school's public health nurses and clinic room aides when you return on April 12, 2004.

Public health plays an important part in all Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS). In fact, public health nurses and clinic room aides – employees of the Fairfax County Health Department – can be found in every school health clinic. By working closely with FCPS and families, public health nurses and clinic room aides play a vital role in ensuring that each student achieves the most from his or her education.

Public health nurses do this by identifying health conditions that may impair a student's ability to learn, and developing a plan to minimize the condition's impact on the school day. They are the central link among parents, school, and community in promoting healthy behaviors. Clinic room aides provide basic care to sick and injured students. Both the nurses and clinic room aides assist the school with vision and hearing screenings. Equally important, public health nurses and clinic room aides provide schools a seamless connection to the Health Department – the agency that monitors communicable disease trends within the schools, and assists in reducing the spread of disease.

The vision of the Fairfax County Health Department is "Healthy People in Healthy Communities." This also means healthy students in healthy schools, and cannot be accomplished without the tireless work of the school public health nurses and clinic room aides.
