During the past quarter, Mantua, along with all other schools in FCPS, completed their *School Improvement Plan*. This year our plans were required to be two-years in length and had to have a continued focus on student achievement in four core areas: Math, Language Arts, History/Social Science and Science. At Mantua, we are committed to addressing the needs of the whole child; therefore, our School Plan establishes objectives for all aspects of our school program.

All grade level teams and specialist teams were involved in determining the School Plan objectives through analysis of their students' formal and informal assessments to determine areas of need. Our School Plan focuses on specific objectives in the following areas: reading readiness skills, reading non-fiction material, writing in the content areas, compacted math, use of visual images for Social Studies, and review of Science strands for fifth grade. Additional objectives encourage our students to make connections between classroom curriculum and areas studied through the Arts and through languages, to develop healthy living habits and to demonstrate understanding of Boyer's Core Virtues.

We have established lofty goals for ourselves and your children. Parental support is essential to meet these goals. Many of our parents of our younger children are doing this with their follow-through in the Bag of Books Program, reading to their children and by practicing math skills. It is extremely helpful for parents to actively check with their children regarding homework, supplies and organization of their work. Establishing a set place in your home where your child completes homework and leaves their schoolbag for the next day is very useful. Encouraging and expecting an appropriate level of responsible follow-through on tasks by your child(ren) is also an essential precursor to becoming a successful adult.

Some specific suggestions on how you can support development of your children's writing skills are taken from *Reports to Parents*:

Make time for writing just as you need to make time for reading.

Have the tools on hand, like pen and paper, a special notebook, or a home computer with word processing programs.

Write in front of your children because children learn what they experience.

Make a big deal about their writing successes by praising and displaying what they have accomplished.

Make a book using pictures with captions or short stories.

Our children are technologically savvy – but remember while IMs are quick and fun they do nothing to help children become a better writer. E-mails are better because they allow time and space for children to express themselves.

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. Application Process for Elementary Magnet Schools

The following information will explain the 2006-2007 magnet school application and lottery process for Hunters Woods Elementary School for the Arts and Sciences and for Bailey's Elementary School for the Arts and Sciences.

Bailey's Elementary School for the Arts and Sciences offers an interdisciplinary, concept-based instructional program with an added emphasis on technology, science, math, and the arts. Bailey's resources include a technology lab, a science discovery lab, an electronic music lab, a performing arts theater, a math exploratorium, a fine arts studio, and a communications center consisting of a television studio with video production capabilities. Resource teachers staff the resource areas and collaborate with classroom teachers to coordinate and integrate learning activities.

Hunters Woods Elementary School for the Arts and Sciences offers an interdisciplinary, concept-based instructional program with an added emphasis on fine and performing arts, science, and technology. A science specialist, a technology resource teacher, and additional art classes provide opportunities for all students to enhance their learning. The arts team includes music, art, drama, and film studies teachers. Resource teachers collaborate with classroom teachers to coordinate and integrate learning activities with classroom instruction.

To be eligible to apply, a student must be on or above grade level in language arts and math and demonstrate positive interpersonal and school behavior. Applications will be screened for eligibility, and a lottery will be conducted in mid-March.

Applications are available at your child's school. They are also be located at the following web sites, http://www.fcps.edu/DIS/OEIAS/magnet.htm http://www.fcps.edu/HuntersWoodsES, and http://www.fcps.edu/BaileysES. Parents must complete the appropriate school application and return the form to the Office of Elementary Instruction at Lacey Center. Applications must be postmarked no later than March 1, 2006.
