-President's Report

- Thanks for coming out to our volunteer reception and final meeting of the year
- Traffic Committee follow up PTA, MCA and School Admin have worked together to address traffic issues. Letter sent to Fairfax County officials, consensus was that the right thing to do is to open the Horner Court w/ a gate during school drop off and pick up times. Work will continue over the summer to determine the future of the gate.
- Virginia PTA Advocacy update bills that were advocated for by the PTA organization were voted on in the General Assembly, not all passed
- Movie Night update great fun, positive feedback to schedule more movie nights in the future, next year PE teachers may do them as their Passion Project in coordination with the PTA. \$650 profit for SCA and Eco Team project
- Eco Team update Commercial grade water fountain to be installed outside of the cafeteria that fills water bottles. Ms. Sullivan acknowledged for her work leading the Eco Team; school received the Bronze Award for their Eco Project, in just six months of work. Kids are aiming for gold next year!

Fundraisers

- Carnival/Spring Fling \$2752.44 more Silent Auction payments have come through
- Donations \$53.08
- Fundraising Partnerships \$139.28 from the Amazon Click-Through program, \$19.95 from Amazon Smile, \$311.64 from Giant A+ Rewards, and \$18.71 from 4OurSchool
- Yearbook \$30.00 more came in for cash purchases of the old yearbook

Hospitality & Appreciation Expenses

- Office Staff Appreciation \$179.35 for their lunch/dinner
- Staff Recognition \$47.43 was spent for the administration
- Teacher Appreciation \$380.78 was spent toward the Teacher Appreciation Luncheon (over budget by almost \$131)

Insurance

• We paid \$398 for our annual insurance policy that covers us through next fiscal year.

Member Dues

• We received 3 new members since March 2017 – so we paid National, State, and Local PTAs a total of \$13.50 for our portion of those dues to them.

Programs & Events

- Basketball \$586.60 was spent to purchase their trophies
- Garden & Landscaping I created a new sub-account called "Eco Team" to show where we expensed the pre-approved \$300 grant to help pay for supplies for the Schoolyard Habitat (Ms. Sullivan's Eco Team, near SACC). Also, per Kati Hesford, we used \$64.00 of the garden and landscaping budget to help with the last expenses for this new garden area. Parent Education \$77.73 was used for foods during the events and paper for fliers
- Raccoon Runners \$115.70 paid for additional t-shirts, party supplies, and snacks
- Sixth Grade Party \$3715 has been deposited thus far, and another deposit was made today and not accounted for yet in the books. Also, we paid for the DJ and tshirts, totaling \$1567.00 in expenses so far. **Note: \$400 was moved to a new account named "Uncategorized Expense" to show where funds were spent in this fiscal year for the DJ for last year's party, but the DJ lost the check and I had to reissue.

Teacher's Fund Expense

• Used \$75.00 from this budget to pay for a pianist to accompany the Spring Concert – per a request from Mrs. Fernandez and Mrs. Aberle

Wish Fund

• Per AnnMarie Delvalle, the school needed to purchase an additional cart for the folding chairs. There was still money in the Wish Fund budget, so we paid \$195.99 for this additional cart.

Principal's Wish List

• Per my calculations, we may have approximately \$30,000-\$31,000 to write out to the school to help cover expenses on their wish list at the end of the year.

This is after deducting:

- o \$6200 for DreamBox for next school year that needs to be paid now
- o \$400 (may be less) for field day expenses
- o \$100 (may be less) for Volunteer Appreciation expenses
- o \$250 (may be less) for MentorWorks expenses
- o Any other end of the year expenses not yet accounted for (Sixth Grade Party, Website, Gardens)
