## -Treasurer's Report

### Fundraisers

- \$40.60 was spent to award the winning Box Tops Classroom their pizza party (Mrs. Hartwell's class) there isn't an expense account for Box Tops, so I've put the expense in the Income to then just reduce the income we'll receive.
- We've received \$1,401.00 in Directory Sponsorship Ads
- Another \$129.50 in donations have come in from checks and MemberPlanet

- We've received almost \$34,000.00 in donations for the Fall Fundraiser "Run for Rocky". After our expenses, our current net profit is \$26,516.05. This is under what we budgeted by about \$5000
