Sponsorships/Directory - \$400.00 from two sponsors placing ads in the directory Donations - \$177.30 from Open House and MemberPlanet Fundraising Partnerships - \$14.84 from Amazon Smile Yearbook - \$105 collected over the summer in the front office for last year's books

EXPENSES

Ice Cream & Pizza Social - \$956 spent so far (\$200 to start the cash boxes, \$606 for pizzas, \$150 for DJ services)

Membership Dues

\$630 in dues received at Open House, which equals 42 members. Many more envelopes have been received in the PTA mailbox in the front office.

\$336.96 transferred through MemberPlanet's Campaign page for 24 members – more to be transferred soon.

Total Other Income

Our checking account balance in the PTA's account after everything has cleared to date is \$18,902. In this section on the budget, we are showing \$14,000 of that amount available for use for this year's budget. In the past, this has not been done, therefore if we voted to spend more than what our budget allowed due to having more funds in the PTA's checking account, it then reflected a negative net income on the budget. This way, we can show what we really would like to be able to spend down in our checking account, while maintaining a "cushion" in the account for future use if necessary.
