#### -President's Report

#### Sam Leiber

- 1. Yearbook: The yearbook endeavor is now running smoothly thanks to Jane Dunfee and Shelley Roberts. Josten has the site up and running.
- 2. The School Bond vote passed.
- 3. Nominating Committee: We need to start thinking about next year's nominating committee to avoid a stressful process. Sam will put a call out in the Alert News.
- 4. Drama Club: This year drama club decided to have the Fall production later in the term because it was a more difficult production. It has been determined that the more difficult productions should be saved for the Spring due to the timing of the basketball season. Keeping the Fall performance earlier in the term, right before Thanksgiving is better.
- 5. National PTA School of Excellence Program: Sam put a survey out in Alert News but only received 20 (approximately) responses. He spoke with VA PTA and there is no required number of responses. He submitted responses to VA PTA. After reviewing the various tracks that can be pursued, Sam determined that the track that Mantua should pursue is that of Advocacy speaking up for every child. How do we better communicate with parents? Sam will start a process around this.

# -Treasurer's Report

#### Budget Numbers Since Last Meeting, October 19, 2017

## Fundraisers

- Carnival/Spring Fling \$50 received from a sponsor that forgot to give us a check from last school year
- Sponsorships/Directory \$838.34 more received from Directory Sponsors for a total of \$1,407.46, however, our Expenses total is \$1,513.81 to print the directories. We did not receive enough in sponsorships to cover the cost of the directories. Our Membership Dues collected will cover this deficit.
- Donations \$721.14 received, \$563.70 of which came from Benevity (They allow corporations to participate in online giving, matching, volunteering, and integrated grant management solutions to their employees.)
- eScrip a deposit was received for \$1.79
- Fundraising Partnerships –\$91.78 via the Amazon Click-Through program and \$16.98 via the Amazon Smile program
- Restaurant Nights \$400 was sent by Kai10 Sushi!!
- Fall Fundraiser/Run for Rocky Received total Income \$38,280.47 less Expenses \$7,199.44 for a profit of \$31,081.03.

#### **Member Dues**

- \$242.52 more received for a total of \$5,422.80
- Sent checks to the Virginia PTA and the Fairfax County Council of PTAs to pay our membership dues for state/national/local -- \$1,508.00 total paid

#### **Programs & Events**

- Basketball received an additional \$220.98, total \$15,327.70 in Income no expenses received as of yet
- Book Fair Brought in \$11,772.86. Waiting for the invoice to deduct our expenses so that I can write the Book Fair Library Proceeds check.
- Chat 'n' Chew Income has been reduced to \$1,845.00 due to credits being processed to PTA members for their club discounts of \$10 each.
- Drama Club Income has been reduced to \$8,266.32 due to credits being processed to PTA members for their club discounts of \$10 each. Expenses received thus far are \$4,054.00 (includes \$3500 to DramaWorks, T-shirts, Pizza orders for the upcoming show). More to come.
- Kids Care Club \$555.00 Income; \$193.88 Expenses for Teacher Gifts and projects created for homeless gifts
- Raccoon Runners Income reduced to \$3,794.44 due to credits being processed to PTA members for their club discounts of \$10 each. Expenses are currently at \$2,630.46 (includes snacks, t-shirts, Frotst 5k, Turkey Trot registrations)
- Garden & Landscaping Expenses \$345.29 more for a total of \$514.04 (includes a tree, flowers, birdfeeder, suet/seeds, pots, plants, sign for Loveemma.com, and items for the front garden)
- Eco Team purchased a large can for recycling, dolly, & liner bags for \$189.98
- Reflections -- \$344.38 total (trophies, kit supplies)
- School Spirit Displays Holiday décor for the front entrance Expenses of \$25.80

- WIDA: <u>www.wida.us</u> "WIDA supports academic language development and academic achievement for linguistically diverse students through high quality standards, assessments, research, and professional development for educators."
