Introduction

The Reflections Arts Program is sponsored by the National PTA and encourages students to express themselves through the arts. Students create original works of art and write thoughtful statements in response to a student-selected theme. The theme for the 2021-2022 school year is: I Will Change The World By...

The artwork and statements are anonymous to the judges and are evaluated at the school or local level. A school finalist in each category and division moves on to the County level. Winners at the County level move on to the District, and so on to State and finally to the Nationals.

Students submit their artwork in one division:

- Primary (Pre-K to Grade 2)
- Intermediate (Grades 3-5)
- Middle School (Grades 6-8)
- High School (Grades 9-12)

Within their division, students may submit their artwork in one or more categories:

- Dance Choreography
- Film Production
- Literature
- Music Composition
- Photography
- Visual Arts (2D or 3D)

Rules and Guidelines for All Entries

Here are some rules and guidelines for all entries:

All Artwork:

Only new pieces of artwork inspired by the current year's theme may be submitted.

Preserve the original artwork as it moves onto the next level, or in case the original artwork is requested, or if there is an opportunity to display the artwork in a show or gallery.

Because the program is designed to encourage and recognize each student's individual creativity, an adult may NOT alter the creative integrity of a student's work. And, collaboration with other students is NOT allowed.

All Entries:

Each entry must be the original work of one student only.

The artwork and statements are anonymous to the judges.

Please do not have the student's name in the artwork or in the recording.

Please write the following on the back of the entry or entry packaging:

- o student's name
- o title of the artwork
- arts category
- o division

Plagiarized entries will be disqualified.

Use of copyrighted material is prohibited, except for background music in dance choreography and film production entries.

Images and recordings of artwork to be submitted digitally.

Take a very high resolution photo, so the judges can zoom in and see the details of your artwork.

Be mindful of the size or length of the artwork in each category.

Title:

Each entry must contain a title.

Artistic Statement:

Each entry must include an artist statement. The artist statement communicates:

- what inspired the work
- o how it relates to the theme
- the content of the work

The statement must include at least 10 words and not exceed 100 words.

Take your time when responding to the "Artist Statement" on the form. The judges will consider the student's interpretation of the theme as well as the technical execution.

Details and Artwork Size Requirements:

Include the appropriate information in the Details field. Refer to the <u>Rules and Guidelines for Each Category</u> section.

Rules and Guidelines for Each Category

Here are some rules and guidelines for each category:

Dance Choreography:

Solo and ensemble works of all dance styles are accepted.

Entrant must be the choreographer.

Entrant may also be the performer, or one of the performers.

Video file must not exceed 5 minutes in length and 1,000 MB (1,000 megabyte) in file size. Video file must be in MP4, MOV, or AVI format.

In the Details field, include length and size of the video and cite the background music.

Film Production:

Accepted short film styles include:

Animation, narrative, documentary, experimental, or media presentation.

Entrant must be the screenwriter, cinematographer, editor and producer.

Use of PowerPoint is prohibited.

Video file must not exceed 5 minutes in length and 1,000 MB (1,000 megabyte) in file size. Video file must be in MP4, MOV, or AVI format.

In the Details field, include the length and size of the video and cite the background music.

Literature:

Accepted forms of fiction and nonfiction include:

Prose, poetry, reflective essay, screen play and play script, narrative, and short story.

Writing may be in the entrant's primary language, as long as an interpretive English translation is also attached.

Writing must not exceed 2,000 words, handwritten or typed.

Document must be single-sided print on 8 ½x11" paper.

Digital file must be in PDF.

In the Details field, include the number of words.

Music Composition:

All music styles and combinations of instrumentation are accepted.

Entrant must be the composer. Entrant may also be the performer, or one of the performers.

Audio recording must not exceed 5 minutes in length and 1,000 MB (1,000 megabyte) in file size. Audio recording must be in MP3 or WAV.

Notation (score/tablature) in PDF is required for Middle School (Grades 6-8) and High School (Grades 9-12) Divisions.

In place of a notated score, entrant may include a written reflective statement that provides a musically technical explanation of how you wrote the music (100 words or less). Document should be single-side printed on 8 1/2 x11" paper. Digital file should be in PDF.

In the Details field, include a list of musicians and/or instrumentation. If a reflective statement is provided, include number of words.

Photography:

A variety of digital techniques are accepted and include, but not limited to: Multiple exposure, negative sandwich and photogram

Entrant must be the photographer.

Collages, collections of photos, and framed prints are not accepted. Note: Collages are an accepted form under the Visual Arts category.

Photo must be a single print or digital image.

Print image dimension must be no smaller than 3x5 inches and no larger than 8x10 inches. Print image must be mounted on a mat or poster board no larger than 11x14 inches.

Digital image dimension must be at least 640x960 pixels and resolution of at least 300 dpi. Digital image must be in JPG or PNG.

In the Details field:

For print images, include dimension and overall dimension with matting (inches). For digital images, include dimension (pixels) and resolution (dpi).

Visual Arts:

Works of both fine and design arts are accepted, including but not limited to:

- architectural drawing and models
- o ceramics
- o collage
- o computer generated images and graphics
- o crafts
- drawing
- o fashion clothes
- fiber work
- jewelry
- o mixed media
- painting
- o printmaking
- o sculpture

Visual Arts – Two-Dimensional (2D)

2D artworks must be mounted on a sturdy material that is no larger than 24x30 inches with matting.

Framed entries are not accepted.

Digital image dimension must be at least 640x960 pixels and resolution of at least 300 dpi. One digital image of the artwork must be in JPG or PNG.

In the Details field, include dimension with matting (inches).

Visual Arts – Three-Dimensional (3D)

Digital image dimension must be at least 640x960 pixels and resolution of at least 300 dpi. Three digital images of the 3D artwork at different angles must be in JPG or PNG.

In the Details field, include dimension, including the height (inches).

Special Artists: Students who identify as having a disability and may receive services under IDEA or ADA: Section 504 may enter in the Special Artist Division or grade division most closely aligned to their functional abilities.

All submissions must be solely created by the special artist.

An adult may assist with typing, holding a camera, etc. Use of adaptive technology is allowed.

Individuals providing assistance may not involve themselves in the artistic process.

- 1. Please ensure the artwork follows the Rules and Guidelines for All Entries.
- 2. Please ensure the artwork follows the Rules and Guidelines for the specific category.
- 3. Please name files in the following format: category division studentFirstName studentLastName

- 4. Be prepared to provide the following information:
 - Student name, grade, age
 - Name of homeroom teacher
 - Parent or guardian name, email address, phone number, mailing address
 - Signatures of student and parent/guardian to acknowledge the agreement
 - Title of the artwork
 - Grade Division and Arts Category
 - Details of the artwork such as:
 - o Length and file size of video or audio recording
 - Number of words
 - List of musicians, instruments
 - Background music citation
 - Dimension in inches and/or pixels
 - Resolution in dpi
 - o Filename of the entry
 - Filename of reflective statement for a music composition entry
 - Artistic statement
 - o 10 to 100 words describing the artwork and how it relates to the theme
- 5. Enter the information for one artwork entry into the Mantua Elementary School PTA Reflections Entry Form.
- 6. Submit the image or recording of the artwork:
 - Drag and drop the file(s)
 - Or, browse and select the file(s)
- 7. Click the Submit button.

Reflections Theme Search

The Reflections Arts Program encourages students to explore the arts and express themselves in response to a student-submitted theme. The theme is created by a student and selected two years in advance through the annual Theme Search Contest.

Two years ago, the 2021-2022 Reflections theme "I Will Change the World By..." was submitted by Lydia Keel from Spanish Fork Junior High School PTSA in Utah.

Last year, the 2022-2023 Reflections theme was selected and was submitted by a Jason Yevin from Salk/Macarthur PTSA in New York: Show Your Voice!

Right now, the search is on for the 2023-2024 Reflections theme! The theme from the winning student will inspire hundreds of thousands of students to create meaningful artwork and demonstrate their thoughtful and soulful creative abilities. The winning student will also receive a \$100 award and national recognition.

- o Inspiring, unique, and unlike past program themes
- Clear and appropriate for all grade levels
- Applicable to all arts categories
- Relevant in two years
- Promotes PTA values
