## V. Principal's Reports: Linda Shannon

- Mask updates have come out through community messaging. I want to mirror what kids and teachers are doing. Mantua has adjusted to this the best compared to her colleagues.
- Had Read across America was so great last week. Librarians really helped with that, and it was really cool.
- ESSER continues to do our interventions. Given based on population of school, making sure kids are making gains and measuring it. LEXIA, got a site license for everyone. Teachers are incorporating in all of their classes too. You can see exactly where gaps are and in an intentional way.

*Parent Question* : Money the school given specifically to get kids caught up? Can we get more teachers for small groups? What I am hearing is that some kids are struggling, but less small groups. Should there be more levels of small groups?

*Ms. Shannon:* Special education is separate from this. IEPs are different from this, data and progress monitoring determines this. ESSER is really for everyone, federal grant money, anticipate this challenge b/c of what they have experienced the last few years....so they did some grouping for ESSER support – if they aren't accessing it, that means they didn't qualify for it. but if you are concerned you can bring that up to staff.

Academic and Wellness leads – Admin team worked together to create interventions. Student needs really drove the interventions. Still look at individual children, sometimes it isn't the right fit. Reach out if you feel like it was a miss for your child.

Couldn't buy positions with it – limited on how you could use the money. Would have loved to pay for staffing, reduce student ratios, but weren't able to do that.

*Parent Question*: Can we do another round of parent teacher conferences? *Admin:* Anytime!

*Parent Question:* When will the cafeteria change back to round tables?

*Ms.Shannon*: Very grateful we set up as we did this year, but hoping lunch will be back to normal next year. Can't take the risk to move desks out and have to put them back. Some parents aren't so comfortable with changing lunch. Outdoor lunch will be starting back next week. Keeping mitigation strategies in place as they have. Nothing has changed except masks. Don't really need to contract trace unless there is a class outbreak. Worried to have to go back on something.

*Parent Question:* Do kids choose if they eat outside or inside? *Ms. Shannon*: No - there is a schedule based on the class, took turns but can seat anywhere

*Ms. Shannon*: Professional development day was a great success and the PTA sponsored waffles were amazing!
